Amanda Mkaka and **Caroline Mapenquissa** from our SBST committee attended an ADHD and Children with depression workshop.

Teachers can play an ongoing and pivotal role in these children's lives in the areas of recognising features, communicating with specialists, and managing these children's behaviour in a classroom environment. As such it is vital that teachers have an in-depth understanding of ADHD. This should encompass knowledge about the causes of ADHD, which are multifactorial, with genetics interacting with environmental factors to produce the ADHD phenotype.

Management of these children often involves medication, however, in a classroom setting, certain behavioural techniques are helpful to allow these children to reach a level where they could be able to perform well both academically and socially.
